Trade Means Growth for South Carolina

International trade—exports and imports of goods and services—supports 580,000 jobs in South Carolina, or about 1 in 5 total jobs in the state.

Key facts about trade and jobs:

- · The share of South Carolina jobs supported by trade has more than doubled since the early 1990s.
- · Jobs in export-intensive industries offer compensation that averages about 16 percent higher than other jobs.
- · Imports let American families stretch their budgets and help U.S. manufacturers keep costs down and competitiveness up.
- Over 6,500 South Carolina companies exported in 2022. Nationally, 97% of trading firms are small-and medium sized enterprises.
- · Since 2008, companies that import or export goods have accounted for 3 out of 5 new American jobs.

South Carolina companies exported \$45 billion in goods and services in 2023 to more than 200 markets around the world.



America's FTA partners account for just 6% of the world's population but purchased 36% of South Carolina's goods exports in 2023.

South Carolina's goods exports to Belgium were \$2.0 billion in 2023, a nearly 200% increase since 2014.

Canada was the top export market for services exports in 2023 at \$653 million.

South Carolina's total goods and services exports increased by \$9.1 billion (26%) between 2014 and 2023.

In 2023, South Carolina exported \$37 billion in goods and \$7.5 billion in services — a 10-year high for services.

Most services export growth has been driven by digital trade, which is allowing more South Carolina companies to reach customers abroad more easily.

South Carolina's top transportation equipment exports in 2023 were passenger vehicles (\$10.2 billion) and aircrafts and parts (\$6.3 billion).

South Carolina's top agricultural exports in 2023 were animal feeds (\$235 million) and soybeans (\$202 million).

South Carolina's exports of digitally tradable services reached \$3.4 billion in 2023.

Foreign-headquartered companies directly employ 170,900 South Carolina workers.

German-owned companies employ the most South Carolina workers (38,500), followed by French-owned companies (23,000).

Each job at a foreign-owned company typically supports three other U.S. jobs indirectly.

In 2021, U.S. affiliates of foreign-owned companies employed 8 million Americans, exported \$412 billion in goods, and spent \$78 billion on R&D.
